EXTRA-CURRICULAR INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES

All extra-curricular interscholastic programs shall require Board approval and shall operate under the general supervision of the activity directors and principals. Qualified personnel shall be assigned to supervise, coach and advise the various groups and sports as required.

Membership of the district or an individual school in Wyoming High School Activities Association (WHSAA) shall be subject to the approval of the Board. The Board shall review the constitution and bylaws of the association and the rules and regulations for member teams before granting approval. Each high school principal, or his designee, shall serve as the voting representative to all meetings of athletic associations or leagues in which the district maintains membership.

The eligibility of students to participate in athletic programs shall be determined in accordance with regulations of the WHSAA. However, the Board may establish additional requirements for eligibility from time to time. Home school students may participate in interscholastic activities provided the home school has affiliated with WHSAA as an affiliate and has paid the required membership fee and has proof of catastrophic insurance from WHSAA.

Activity trips are defined by the Wyoming Department of Education as:

Travel inside the state of Wyoming and within one hundred and fifty (150) miles of the Wyoming border for athletic and non-athletic activities sanctioned by the Wyoming High School Activities Association (WHSAA), and/or school sponsored athletic and non-athletic activities in grades preceding high school which directly correspond to those high school activities sanctioned by the Wyoming High School Activities Association.

Proposed trips must have the approval of the school principal and activity director. Administrative consultation and approval is expected to occur at the time the trip is being considered. Schools are expected to adhere, as a minimum, to WHSAA rules for all activity travel and participation.

The school district does not fund national competitions or national conventions for students. Schools may, however, with principal and superintendent permission, allow for activities which enable groups or organizations to raise funds. Fund raising plans for a national convention or competition should be part of a well-organized, yearlong activity program.
