2021 - 2022 School Year Interim Smart Start Plan

This interim plan will be updated based on the requirements of the “American Rescue Plan” through the Wyoming Department of Education.

Our goal is to maximize 160 in-person opportunities (153 in Cokeville) for progress and growth in the areas of academics, activities, and social and emotional learning.

To reach our goal to the greatest extent possible, and given the current challenges and risks presented by the COVID, please consider the following prevention strategies:

1. Vaccinations
 - a. Wyoming Public Health recommends that all individuals eligible should be vaccinated.
2. Indoor Face Coverings
 - a. Wearing face coverings is a personal choice
 - b. Please respect each individual’s choice
3. Spacing
 - a. To the greatest extent possible, maintain three feet of physical distance
4. Healthy Practices
 - a. Regularly wash your hands
 - b. Students will have easy access to hand sanitizer
 - c. Students will have individual access to devices and materials to limit sharing
 - d. Follow respiratory hygiene/cough etiquette like cover your cough and sneezes
5. Screenings
 - a. Stay home if you are sick

6. Cleaning
 - a. Additional staff to disinfect throughout the school day
7. Health Orders
 - a. Currently, there are no health orders
 - b. Currently, there are no restrictions to buildings, the school day, or activities
 - c. Currently, there are no restrictions to parents/volunteers entering the buildings
8. When there is a positive COVID Test
 - a. If you test positive for COVID follow testing site guidance, healthcare provider, or public health guidance.

9. Remote Learning:

For all elementary students in K-3 grade, if there is a Covid-related isolation/quarantine, the teacher will confer with the parent to make arrangements for work-at-home for up to 10 days per occurrence. Please allow 24-48 hour notice to allow teachers to prepare materials. At a minimum, teachers will provide packets for K-3 students. Decisions regarding Zoom meeting or Google Classroom link will be made on a case-by-case basis. Please contact your student's school to initiate a remote learning request.

For all elementary students 4-6 grade, if there is a Covid-related isolation/quarantine, the teacher will provide synchronous remote learning for up to 10 days per occurrence. Please allow 24-48 hour notice to allow teachers to prepare materials. Please contact your student's school to initiate a remote learning request.

Secondary students in grades 7-12 will have access to remote learning for Covid-related isolation/quarantine. Please allow 24-48 hour notice to allow teachers to prepare materials. Remote learning will generally be provided through Canvas and/or Zoom. Remote students must be approved by the administration for up to 10 days per occurrence.
