A Message From...

It is hard to believe it is October already. We are excited about the progress students have made so far this year in all areas. It is fun to watch students learn and excel in their classes while also experiencing the different after school opportunities we have available. Thank you for your work in helping ensure your child is successful in his/her classes and monitoring your child's academic progress.

We have a number of ways to help you child be successful. Mrs. Nate sends out weekly communication (please contact her if you are not receiving this for some reason) to ensure you are aware of different support being offered. We rotate before school help between the teachers to provide a variety of subject area supports. We also rotate during lunch help to provide opportunities for students to get extra help during lunch. We also provide support during daily. This happens automatically if your child has a low score on a test, is missing an assignment, or has a low score in a class overall. This can also happen through teacher or student request. Our goal is to get your child with the classroom teacher he/she is needing additional help from. Finally, we provide Friday school support on some Fridays on a rotating basis between the content areas. This will be assigned if there is a reason for the assignment but can also be used based on student or parent request. Thank you for taking advantage of these available supports as your child needs them.

We are excited to have a visiting author who will provide an assembly focused on literacy. The assembly will start at 1:00 on October 24th and will be presented by Tyler Whiteside. This will be a unique opportunity for students to gain access into the perspective of a published author.

Cokeville High School will begin a guided reading group as part of our regular schedule in the next few months. We are still in the planning stages of this adjustment, but this is an adjustment that will provide more opportunity to read and discuss literature during the regular day. Students will select and work through reading and discussing novels from our collection of over 150 novel group sets. We are excited about this opportunity to promote literacy and further build students ability to think critically about different text.

We are beginning to have more and more events. Please continue to watch for information about the events communicated weekly by Mrs. Nate. This will ensure you are aware of any updates to event times or potential rescheduling. Things are busy, but we are excited our students have the opportunity to participate in a variety of different after school activities to help enhance learning.

Cokeville Schools received a 21st Century After School grant. We are grateful for the additional opportunities this grant will provide. You may have been aware of the drone camp we were able to offer through this grant to provide students with additional exposure to technology. Thank you for Mrs. Pope for creating this opportunity for our students. Please watch for additional information about future opportunities provided through the 21st Century After School program grant.

Remember our first parent teacher conferences are set for the week of November 11th. Please feel free to reach out to teachers as needed to discuss your child's academic progress.

Hello parents! We are excited about our new Over-the-Counter medication policy this year. Our LCSD2 Nursing Team worked hard last year in developing and implementing this policy to provide better care to our students. We now have Over-the-Counter medication permission forms at CES and CHS for parents to complete if they desire. Only medications selected on the form will be administered by a nurse or secretary after a confirmation phone call to parents. These forms can be updated at any time. In the future Over-the-Counter medication authorization will be included in the online registration process.

October is National Dental Hygiene Month. Halloween and fall celebrations can mean candy in abundance! Sweets and treats can be a lot of fun on special days, but having good dental hygiene is important. Here are some tips to keep those pearly whites strong & those gums healthy!

- 1. Brush 2x/day, replace your toothbrush every 3 months.
- 2. Switch to a soft-bristled toothbrush.
- 3. Floss once a day, it's best to floss before bedtime to remove any food particles.
- 4. Get regular cleanings, every 6 months.


