Osmond's 5th Graders traveled to Minnetonka Caves!~

Osmond's 5th graders continued the tradition of having the first field trip of the year. On Wednesday, August 28th they traveled to St. Charles, Idaho for their annual visit to Minnetonka Caves.

Googling Minnetonka Cave will bring up several sites which allow those of us unable to accompany the 5th graders the opportunity of sharing in the learning experience. https://www.fs.usda.gov/recarea/ctnf/recreation/otheractivities/ recarea/?recid=70736&actid=102 is a great site with lots of interesting facts. If you are fortunate to visit the cave, a coat and maybe even gloves are advised as the cave remains a constant 40° F.

Other interesting facts include:

- Minnetonka Cave is an important hibernaculum to five bat species.
- Fossils that lived in tropical waters are found in the ceiling and walls.
- The cave is still "alive" as formations continue to grow.


Asking "How was school today?" might not get you far. Instead, ask questions like these for a better picture of your youngster's day:
