NURSE'S CORNER

Warm weather is on its way, HURRAY! That means more time outside in the beautiful sunshine. May we all live by the old adage “an **ounce of prevention** is worth a pound of cure.”

Here is an easy reminder of how to stay safe this summer along with some additions from my years of working in the Emergency Room.

1. Buckle up! Please wear your seat belt and make sure your children are buckled in an appropriately sized car seat or booster. I promise, SEATBELTS SAVE LIVES!
2. Wear a helmet when on a bike, roller skates/blades, scooters, motorcycles etc. Helmets SAVE the BRAIN!
3. Trampoline safety: Install a safety net around the trampoline and cover the trampoline's frame, spring, and hooks with protective safety pads. One jumper at a time and adult supervision will decrease the accidents that happen on trampolines.
